Dear Property Owner/Resident,

On September 6, 2011, the El Segundo City Council unanimously determined that the City will pay for trash collection services at condominiums or stock cooperatives with four or fewer units. This letter supersedes the City's August 22, 2011 letter in which you were notified that effective November 1, 2011 the City would no longer provide free trash collection services.

To qualify for City paid for services, property owners and customers must use standard 35-gallon (or smaller) trash collection bins that can be safely lifted by a wasting hauling operator. Properties or residents using 3-yard³ metal bins or larger cannot be serviced due to the manual collection methods employed.

Why are you receiving this letter?

You are receiving this letter because the City Council has determined that as a condo or stock cooperative owner with four or fewer units, **you are eligible to receive free trash collection services.** You will not need to arrange for and pay for your own trash hauling services as long as you use standard trash collection containers (typically 35-gallon) that can be safely lifted by one waste hauling operator. The City will automatically add you to the list of parcels identified to receive free trash service and provided to the waste hauler for service commencing with the new contract on November 1, 2011. No action is required on your part to receive this free service.

However, if you do not wish to receive the free service, please notify me at your earliest convenience so that we may remove you from the list (the City pays approximately \$110 annually for each service address identified). Please note that you may be added or deleted from the list at any time simply by requesting it.
